**Church Word:**

Stole: A stole is a long, narrow strip of cloth worn by clergy as an emblem of ordination. The priest's stole is worn around the neck with the ends crossed in front or allowed to hang straight down. The color is usually determined by the liturgical color of the season. The particular sacrament being conferred sometimes guides color selection: red for ordinations and white for weddings.

The mission of the United Thank Offering is to expand the circle of thankful people. To achieve this mission, we encourage daily prayers offerings, and awareness of the abundance of God's blessings.

If you do not have a Blue Box, please consider taking one from the table in the back of the church. It can serve as a gentle reminder for the whole family to give thanks each day for our many blessings.

Your offering will be sent, along with those from nearly every other Episcopal parish in the United States, to the Executive Council of UTO. Grants are made annually in support of programs within Anglican provinces and dioceses throughout the world in response to requests which are carefully screened and must meet rigid criteria. Every penny collected is available to use for grants. All expenses are paid through a trust fund set up by ECW.

What is an endowment? An endowment is defined as a gift of money or income producing property, to a public organization (including churches, universities, hospitals, etc.), given for a specific purpose (such as research, development, spreading the gospel, etc.). Generally, the endowment asset is kept intact and only the income generated by it is consumed.

We will periodically provide information regarding endowments through the newsletter and Sunday bulletin. Feel free to ask any committee member questions regarding the endowment. If we do not have the answer, we will get the correct information to you.
